

CELEBRATING THE 25th ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEDICATION OF OUR CHURCH June 28, 1998

This week we celebrate the 25th anniversary of the dedication of our new church building in 1998. Our history goes back to the first immigrants who settled here to work on the canal. Mass was celebrated with other congregations or in homes until permission was given by the diocese to build their own parish church in East Millstone. As the parish grew, Fr Stan was able to purchase land in Millstone Borough and a community center was built where Mass was also celebrated for many years as well as in the "little church" in East Millstone. Finally, after much prayer and planning and hard work, the present Church was built and dedicated in 1998..

We especially remember all the parishioners who volunteered and worked closely with Father Ray and liturgical consultants to choose the design of the building and all the furnishings and embellishments. For those who still worship here, it is remembered as a time of great community spirit.

Today, under the leadership of Fr. Hank, renovations and updating continue to meet the needs of our growing, vibrant community as well as a changing world. Soon we will begin building an outdoor pavilion where Mass and other activities will take place. It is only fitting that this new project begins as we celebrate the past 25 years.

As the "living Church" we honor this consecrated building as the sacred place where we gather as a community, listen to God's Word, celebrate the Sacraments, and share in the Eucharist. We are reminded of God's goodness to us and how we have been called together as a community. and we rededicate ourselves to God's service.

Dear All. Christ's Peace!

Alterations in Receiving Communion - It was a grace to see so many so eager to receive the Blood of Christ. It was the first time we have offered the chalice in three long years. Thanks for your patience as we tweak the process to make it as user-friendly as possible.

The Sacrament of the Sick - Come September, we will offer 12 scheduled anointings per year. For now, keep letting me know when you are approaching surgery or treatment, or have recently received a significant diagnosis. Remember - it is NOT the sacrament of the dying. It is the Sacrament of the Sick.

The Return of the Offertory Processions – Starting September 16, we will ask people to bring the gifts up during the offertory at the 8:00 and 9:30 Masses. Stay tuned for details about signing up.

Our Year of Eucharistic Renewal - Remember come September, we will focus on one question: "What do I mean when I say 'Amen' when receiving Communion?" Much light can flow from the answers.

Letters of Suitability - Many parishioners receive requests to serve as godparents or confirmation sponsors. The church where that happens will ask you for a "letter of suitability." Beyond the few canonical requirements, I ask only one question, "Do you regularly attend Mass?" An advantage of standing outside before and after all Masses is that I recognize the Mass-goers. So please, if you regularly attend Mass here, it will be easy for you to obtain a Letter of Suitability. No Worries! (It is NOT about registration or donations!)

In-Reach vs Outreach? - Some of our ministries primarily serve our own parishioners. We are starting to think of these as the "In-reach Ministries" for which AnnaMaria Realbuto is the facilitator. Other ministries primarily serve neighbors near and far. These are the "Outreach Ministries" that Victor Fung is facilitating.

Will Your Ministry Need Donations of Money or Physical Items? - Victor is already making great strides toward organizing our contributions of money and physical items (clothes, books, tools, etc.) Starting in September we will have year-long schedules for monetary donations to the Poor Box and donations of physical items to the collection bins. The planning helps assure that every worthy cause gets support and that you can set giving priorities. With justice for all

Politics is noble, among the highest forms of charity, Pope Paul VI once said. Pope Francis speaks often about the intersection of politics and justice. Yet Francis points out, "Some people continue to defend trickle-down theories which assume that economic growth, encouraged by a free market, will inevitably succeed in bringing about greater justice.... This opinion ... expresses a crude and naive trust in the goodness of those wielding economic power and in the sacralized workings of the prevailing economic system." Politics is noble, but regrettably, not all politicians are. Work for justice, both in the system and on the street.

The journey of faith has surprising twists

French missionary to the United States Simon Bruté, who died on this day in 1839, lived through major upheaval. His father came from a wealthy, aristocratic family. His mother often told him, "You were born to live in opulence." But Bruté later wrote, "God ordered it otherwise." His father died deeply in debt and his affairs in disarray. His mother saved the boy from military service during France's Reign of Terror. Disguised as a baker's assistant, he brought the Eucharist to imprisoned priests. He was eventually ordained, moved to Baltimore to teach, and later became the first bishop of the Diocese of Vincennes, Indiana. Life rarely turns out the way you plan, but if you surrender to God's will for you, you might find your faith takes you on an adventure you never could have imagined.

It takes two

When patriarch Nestorius refused to accept Mary as *Theotokos*—Greek for "God bearer"—it was Cyril of Alexandria who took him on. Nestorius insisted that Mary, as human, could only bear another human—not God—thus disputing the Incarnation. Cyril would insist upon the "hypostatic union" of human and divine in Jesus. Or, as proclaimed by the Council of Ephesus: Jesus is always and ever "one person" with "two natures." But another type of union also stirred Cyril. Use his words as your meditation today: "As two pieces of wax fused together make one, so [the one] who receives Holy Communion is ... united with Christ."

Room for everyone at the table

Saint Irenaeus, living a scant 100 years after Jesus, was a staunch defender of orthodoxy and church unity: "The Church, having received this preaching and this faith, although scattered throughout the whole world, yet, as if occupying but one house, carefully preserves it." Yet he also made room for those who, through no choice of their own, lived and died without having heard the Good News: "Christ came not only for those who believed from the time of

Tiberius Caesar, nor did the Father provide only for those who are now, but for absolutely all [persons] from the beginning, who, according to their ability, feared and loved God and lived justly." Focus on loving God and living justly and there will be a place for you at the heavenly feast.

Let your life be transformed

It's hard to imagine the development of the church we know today without Saints Peter and Paul. Saint Peter was among the 12 apostles, one with a starring role in the gospels. Saint Paul's spiritual encounter with Jesus transformed him into a tireless Christian evangelizer and likely author of what eventually became half of the New Testament. Peter and Paul were contemporaries who were leaders in the church and both were martyred around the year 64 as a result. Jesus utterly transformed their lives, leading them to build up the fledgling Christian church. What can you do today to help build the church?

The early followers of Jesus found themselves in a strange new world. Sure, it was the same dusty streets and ebb and flow of life they always had known. Yet nothing was the same. The disciples had to navigate a world in which they found life in the risen Christ but also persecution and even death at the hands of those determined to punish and erase Christianity. Today the church remembers these protomartyrs as being "seeds of life," as early Christian author Tertullian noted. Their faith and witness continue to grow the church. What seeds of life have been sown in your faith journey?

We leave a mixed legacy

When we think of 1776, we think of Anglo colonists up in arms along the East Coast. But on the other side of what is now the continental United States, a very different process was taking place. Spanish Franciscans led by Junípero Serra were establishing missions along what is now the California coast, then Spanish territory. While the legacy of the missions is a mixed one, and rightfully open to scrutiny, near the end of his life Serra made an arduous trip from the California coast to Mexico City and demanded legislation protecting the indigenous people and the missions from military abuse. The result was the first step toward a bill of rights for Native Americans. It might have been Saint Teresa of Ávila who said, "God writes straight with crooked lines."

MEMORIAL OF JUNÍPERO SERRA, PRIEST TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 18:1-15; Matthew 8:5-17 (376). "Amen, I say to you, in no one in Israel have I found such faith."


