

This Week in Prayer, Service & Community

Dear All, Christ's Peace!

Outdoor Mass – Today, Sunday, April 21, we begin 11:30 Mass in the pavilion.

Part of the Mass - From now until early June, at the 4:45, 9:30, and 11:30 Masses, the homily will connect the readings to a particular part of the Mass. The goal is to make ourselves more available to the grace of relational prayer – i.e., to let ourselves be nudged by God beyond reflexive/automatic replies into reflective and relational prayer. Every part of every Mass presents a unique invitation to enter into truly relational prayer. Last week we considered the Penitential Rite and what we can mean when we pray "Lord have mercy; Christ have mercy; Lord have mercy." It is about mercy as reprieve (cancellation of punishment due) and relief (rescue from tough settings). To move further toward relational prayer we want to (i) monotask during that prayer (ii) be mindful of Jesus being mindful of us, with or without imaginative prayer and (iii) customize it with our own particular needs for reprieve and relief. How's that going for you?

Parish Capital Improvement Projects -

With thanks to our Buildings and Grounds Committee, our Finance Council, our Parish Council and, most of all, to you, I want to update you on our three big projects.

The Pavilion – It is now all finished and ready to use. We have had a few details left on the punch list (e.g., this week, paint the outlets and the conduits) but they are finished. We have used it several times, but its official launch is Sunday, April 21, with the 11:30 Mass. The Youth Group will set up the chairs. The bishop will dedicate it this summer. All in, the project cost \$750 less than you contributed.

Worship Space HVAC – This is our least beautiful and most expensive project. We have \$600,000 earmarked for the project and hope it costs less than that. The plans have all been approved and the initial permits granted. The demolition began last week. We hope to have it finished by late May. We will replace the north end equipment and then the south end.

Worship Space and Gathering Space Repairs and Paint – The hardest parts of the repairs are now complete. You can see the new expansion joints (little channels that run up or across the walls) and the repairs of the old sheetrock (nails and screws in dozens of places). Next comes the spackle. We submitted the painting proposal to the diocese this week and should get approval next week. Color choices are almost there. We will start the actual painting AFTER the HVAC is installed and AFTER the new sound panels arrive. The area will look a bit "under construction" until then.

With extra blessings for the remaining days of your Easter season.

One who announces Good News, particularly the message of the gospel. Often refers exclusively to the four gospel writers Mark, Matthew, Luke, and John. The New Testament also uses this term in reference to Philip, the deacon, and Timothy, a worker with Paul.

WHY IT MATTERS

All Christians are summoned to the role of **evangelists**, a term first used in reference to the gospel writers in the third century. As followers of Jesus, our common vocation is to bring Good News to the poor, sick, lonely, imprisoned, and socially marginalized. The words of the four primary **evangelists**—Mark, Matthew, Luke, and John—instruct us in the mission we're invited to share.

From *Evangelii Nuntiandi* (Evangelization in the Modern World): The world is calling for **evangelizers** to speak to it of a God whom the **evangelists** themselves should know and be familiar with [122].

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What's an evangelist?

Evangelist translates from Greek as "messenger of good tidings." All baptized persons are called to be such messengers. Isaiah speaks of the "beautiful feet" of those who bring Good News. Ephesians describes apostles, prophets, and **evangelists** as central players in the church. Biblically, **evangelist** is not an exclusive term.

By the third century, the formal list of **evangelists** is reduced to the four gospel writers, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. They concretized the Good News the church would proclaim going forward.

By the fourth century, the symbology of the four **evangelists** became standardized as man, lion, ox, and eagle. Facing the four directions, these extraordinary creatures are four and yet unified in movement. They also burn like hot coals. Matthew, whose gospel emphasizes Jesus' humanity, is represented by the man. Mark highlights Jesus' divinity and kingship, so is identified as the lion. Luke holds up the sacrificial role of Jesus and so becomes the ox. John is the eagle as his gospel soars with a transcendent perspective on Jesus as the Christ.
