Behind the Scenes of This Week's Readings

Today, the First Sunday of Advent, is the beginning of the new Liturgical Calendar. Advent is taken from the Latin word *adventus* (coming), a translation of the Greek *parousia* (second coming). Most likely its observance began in the 4th century when the Church began to celebrate Christ's birth. It was a time of penance similar to Lent. It has lasted as long as five weeks and as short as 3 days a week. Most importantly, its early history focused on preparing for the Second Coming of Christ. Not until much later was a remembrance of Christ's birth added to the observance of Advent. Today Advent is four weeks long and celebrates both the remembrance of Christ's birth and the preparation for his Second Coming. To everyone's liking, it is not as penitential as Lent.


