

WHAT IS HEALING PRAYER?

Throughout our Catholic history, we have cared for the sick using both prayer and medical knowledge. Today we see our hospitals using medical science as well as chaplains, healing prayers, and the Sacrament of the Sick. Both Scientific and Religious types of medical care work together to do God's will.

- Healing Prayer is a prayer of Petition with a member of the prayer team for healing or a special intention.
 It can be requested by a person, their family, or a friend
- It is a kind of prayer Christians have been making since New Testament times.
- It expects God will heal, although God may not heal what we expect.
- It is not limited to physical healing, but can heal mind, body, spirit and/or soul.
- It may be repeated.
- It often includes a prayer for help and guidance for family members, friends or medical personnel.
- It does not replace normal medical care.
- It is not a sacrament, but a sacramental (like the rosary or benediction).
- Y You are welcome to request healing prayer at our monthly sessions after mass on the 2nd Sunday of the month.

HOLY C.H.O.W. MINISTRY Christian Hospitality on Wheels



HOLY C.H.O.W. has completed one year and 3 months since it began serving in Manville in September 2022. We have served over 3500 meals to more than 2000 people in Manville. And our ministry consists of over 150 parishioners.

Tuesday at 5:30 PM the food truck pulls into Manville and serves hot meals to our patrons there. Through the combined effort of detailed planning and operations, casseroles, bread and roasted vegetables are served.

Our planning and operations begin with a 17 person Leadership Team that meets every other month. On the first weekend of every month, 50 casserole pans are handed out with tested recipes attached. Those casseroles are kept frozen in our freezer, and when ready for use are defrosted and baked each Tuesday morning by the Holy CHOW Kitchen Crew.

Combined with stocking the food truck, baking the casseroles, roasting the veggies, and sorting the breads and sweets donated by Panera Bread in the early morning, the food truck driver is ready to roll by 5 pm to meet the crew in Manville, open its doors at 5:30, say grace with our patrons, and serve the food.

During the summer months, parishioners tend the vast parish garden and gather the produce that we hand out at the food truck. Our fresh produce is also much appreciated and enjoyed! We also use this produce to provide fresh roasted vegetables as well as coleslaw and other vegetable dishes.

Our casseroles, overseen by our dietician, are created to offer a wholesome and healthy meal. Every week we offer a beef and chicken selection.

Every person who works on the food truck attends 2 hours of training. We cover food handling, serving, understanding the ministry and all aspects of the operation, and most importantly, an appreciation and gentle understanding of the people we serve each Tuesday...

We cannot thank the parish and all the Holy C.H.O.W. Team enough for their dedication and on-going development of this ministry. Every week brings new challenges and ideas that continually make this a dynamic ministry fulfilling our mission statement: to serve a meal to those who are hungry in the local area, and to engage our parishioners in a common cause while building community.


