During this coming Holy Week our eyes will be especially drawn to the crucifix. The large central crucifix behind the altar depicts Jesus in the very last moments before his death. His eyes are looking up toward heaven and one can imagine him saying his last words, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Notice, too, his hands. Our Faith teaches us that Jesus was both human and divine. The artist depicted this truth through the way she fashioned his hands: The left hand, open and reaching to heaven, depicts the Divine Nature of Christ. The right hand depicts his human nature. With his clenched hand Jesus is clinging to the precious gift of earthly life he shared with all of us.

HOLY WEEK EVENTS

The most important days of our faith are here. Let's all try to set those days aside for the Lord and for ourselves as well. ... Come celebrate the mysteries of our faith and be with the Lord & our community during this holy time.

CHRISM MASS Tuesday, March 26, 4:00 PM Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi, Metuchen

Bishop James F. Checchio will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests of the Diocese. At the Mass, all priests make a Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service, recommitting themselves to their Bishop and to their ministry to God and His People; the Bishop and all Priests then ask the people for a pledge of their prayerful support.

The Bishop will also bless and consecrate the Holy Oils, which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. The Oil of Catechumens is used to anoint infants and adults before their Baptism; the Oil of the Sick is used on the forehead and hands of the infirm in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; and Sacred Chrism is used to anoint the head of the newly baptized, the foreheads of confirmandi, the hands of a priest at his ordination, the head of a bishop at his ordination, and the altar and walls of new churches.

All are encouraged to join in-person (or watch via livestream), this Chrism Mass.

The Vigil Mass is the most solemn celebration of the year beginning with the lighting of the new fire on the plaza and candlelight procession into church where the readings and song are done in the darkness of waiting. Then the "Gloria" rings out, "Alleluia:" is sung and the water blessed. All of this blends together in a beautiful celebration of the resurrected Christ and the New Life He brings. Traditionally, adults who are becoming new Catholics, celebrate Baptism or make a Profession of Faith at this mass. The Vigil Mass typically takes about 2-1/2 hours, but it is such a wonderful celebration you will wish it had not come to an end!

WORD OF THE WEEK

Prostration \prä-'strā-shən\

Lying face down in a ritual expressing humility, reverence, and submission. Used in the liturgy of ordination, it is also the posture assumed during the entrance ritual on Good Friday when priests and ministers proceed in silence and then reverence the altar before all assembled with a full **prostration**.

CONTEXT

Prostration can carry the symbolism of death—the death to self that comes before the candidate's rebirth into priestly service. —Beafriar.org website

[The Magi] saw the child with Mary his mother. They **prostrated** themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts.

-Matthew 2:11

In Hebrew the root of the word for "dismayed" can also mean "**prostrate**." That's what dismay and fear do. They take the legs from under us.

WHY IT MATTERS

Postures are powerful. We say much without saying a word. Genuflection and kneeling demonstrate respect. The Asian kowtow—kneeling while touching forehead to the ground—is a deeper display of reverence. The rare full **prostration** symbolizes total submission to God alone. The ultimate **prostration** of Jesus on the cross brings about our salvation.

From the Circular Letter Concerning the Preparation and Celebration of the Easter Feasts: This act of **prostration** [on Good Friday], signifies both the abasement of "earthly man" and also the grief and sorrow of the Church.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What is humility?

Humility is just about the exact opposite of everything you see in the world nowadays! To discover the essentials of humility, you have to experiment with self-emptying. Humility recognizes that everything comes from God and belongs to God. Therefore, to God alone go all praise, honor, and glory. When you begin with God and not with yourself, your perspective on reality does a dramatic shift. God's will comes first. "Not my will, but yours be done," as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane.

When you choose the perspective of a humble heart, you become aware that your proper orientation as creatures should be one of obedience—that is, attentive listening—to God's call. It's precisely the attitude of obedience that led to the salvation of the world, as Saint Paul tells us: "[Jesus] humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." Paul explains that humility means putting other people ahead of yourself, thinking of their needs rather than yours. That is so countercultural, jaws will drop whenever you attempt it.
