

This Moment in Prayer, Service and Community

Dear All: Christ's peace!

May Monday's Feast of the Triumph of the Cross focus us on the resurrection and perfect light that follow the deaths of those we remember.

Special Section - Making It Even Easier for Everyone to Return to Weekly Communion

Six months ago we celebrated our last pre-shutdown Sunday Mass. Early concerns about the virus kept the numbers a little low that weekend but, on average, about 1,200 participated in pre-shutdown weekend Masses and about 1,000 people received Communion. A few parishioners, mostly the homebound and people with illness or injury, received Communion outside of Mass. Then it all stopped.

The restart has been steady. We began with Communion Services in the parking lot. Then reintroduced congregations to our indoor, weekend Masses. Next Sunday we will start having Sunday Mass under the tent at 11:30. After that, we will take additional steps toward a more traditional liturgical life. Today, about 225 people receive Communion. About half of them receive at Mass. The 11:30 Mass, and the upcoming reduction in restrictions for some daily Masses, will surely encourage even more people to receive Communion.

My hope is that, while the weather is still good, everyone – other than those who are most vulnerable – will receive Communion once each week, while hearing The Word with other parishioners. The way you receive Communion is entirely up to you. What matters is that we hear The Word, receive Communion, and do so in a congregation of like-souled people. You enjoy four options.

1) Parking Lot Communion Services – These services are ideal for those who want to receive but prefer to take the smallest possible risk of exposure. By staying in your car, you do precisely that. The services include a brief Penitential Rite, Scripture reading and Reflection, additional prayers and Communion. The services take 20-30 minutes and require a reservation.

2) Seraphim Masses – The name comes from the angels who are known as heaven's mightiest care-takers. One weekend Mass and, for now, one

weekday Mass, will be designated as Seraphim Masses. They will benefit from our greatest caretaking and efforts to prevent the virus' spread.

All pews will be fogged directly before the Seraphim Masses

Temperatures of all participants will (probably) be taken as they enter and people with temperatures over 100 will be invited to return when their temperatures decline

Reservations will be required to facilitate contact tracing should it be necessary

Ushers will direct you to your seats in ways that minimize proximity to others

Everyone will be required to wear masks, maintain social distancing, and receive communion as part of the exiting process.

3) Cherubim Masses – This name comes from the angels' junior varsity. They take excellent care of their charges but are not quite at the Seraphim level. One weekend Mass and, for now, three weekday Masses, will be designated as Cherubim Masses. These Masses will satisfy all CDC, NJ, and diocesan requirements

Everyone will be required to wear masks, maintain social distancing, and receive communion as part of the exiting process.

Participants will be required simply to deposit, at the church door, a card with their name and email address or phone number.

Reservations will not be required but attendance will be limited in accord with government mandates and our church's ability to accommodate sociallydistanced congregants

Temperatures will not be taken

Participants can sit in any of the seats that are not roped off but must stay six feet away from nonfamily members.

4) Communion at Home – This is only for the most vulnerable. As mentioned in last week's edition, we are starting to recruit family members to serve as Eucharistic Visitors to their vulnerable relatives.

Please ask me or any staff member for whatever additional information you desire. Also, please let me know if the current schedule does not work for you. The staff and I will do whatever we can to make it as easy as possible for our parishioners to receive Communion, hear the Word, and be with other believers in the way they find most fruitful. Please say a prayer for every volunteer who enables everyone to receive Communion. They are way downright "Seraphimic." Without them we would be severely hosed. (Continued on next page)

11:30 MASS UNDER THE TENT – will resume next week, under the tent. For the first week, until we figure out the best way to configure it all, participation will be limited to (a) 60 people under the tent and (b) ten cars of people pulled up to the Jersey barriers. N.B. – Cars must be turned off for the duration of the Mass. That will help others to hear the Mass and to breathe clean air. Because of the seating limitations, reservations will be required – for now. As we figure it all out, we will welcome more people to sit outside the tent in the enclosed area. Temperatures will NOT be taken.

FIRST COMMUNIONS – All best blessings for the 15 youngsters who will be making their First Communions this week at the specially designated 12:30 Mass. GOD BLESS EACH OF YOU!

HELP FIND A HORSE TRAILER OR TWO? – The extraordinary kindness of a parish family has provided the trailer we use for Communion Services. That trailer is about to find another way to serve the Lord. We need one trailer for the Communion Services and another for storage for the equipment needed for Masses under the tent. And it doesn't have to be a horse trailer. A circus wagon would do fine. Email me.

BAPTISMS – I miss the baptisms even more than I would have imagined. It will be great to get them going. If you have submitted your paperwork and taken the class, I will send you the link to reserve your time.

IHNSC RAFFLE Benefits Homeless Families



In order to be eligible, you must:

• Be a resident of any Somerset County municipality (except Franklin Township) and have a current lease or rent agreement.

• Have a household income that is less than the following income limits, based on family size: 1 Person \$66,900 2 People \$76,500 3 People \$86,100

4 People \$95,600 5 People \$103,200 6 People \$110,900

*Be able to prove that your rent payments were current as of March 2020. • Provide documentation of a COVID-related loss of income after March 9, 2020. Examples include:-

Layoff or Reduced work hours –

Unpaid leave to take care of children due to school and daycare closure -

Self-quarantine for 14 days resulting in a loss of income –

Other consequence of the virus that led to a reduction of income
