Celebrating Silver & Gold Wedding Anniversaries

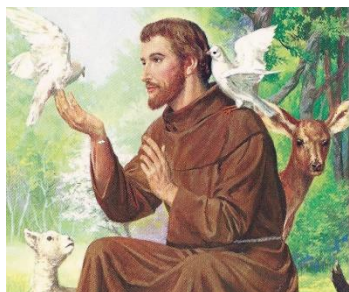

Christ's Peace! Keep working on your Communion Plan and remember to sign up for one of next weekend's parish picnics (see both further below)!

This Moment in Prayer

TUESDAY NIGHT'S COMMUNION SERVICE – Tuesday night's Communion Service earned several parishioners' nominations for the parish hall of fame. If you were one of the Eucharistic Ministers, one of the Ushers, one of the members of the Parish Safety Committee, or one of the Tech Folks, give yourself three cheers. The rain did not keep you away. Neither did the early sunset. Several communicants commented later that they were feeling deeply their need for Communion and feared the service might be called off. Your generosity enabled those people to receive. One car included a man who wanted nothing more than to receive Communion on his birthday. You enabled him to do so – on his 97th birthday. His daughter emailed after the service to praise each of you for completing your duties with grace and style. God bless you! And see you this week. (NB – the Communion Services will continue through the winter and are basically weatherproof – unless it is a severe rain or snow event.)

CURRENT OPPORTUNITIES to HEAR THE WORD and RECEIVE COMMUNION with OTHERS – Our efforts to provide something for everyone continues, with God's great grace, to push forward. Some want assurances of extra safety. Some want to stay in their cars. Some prefer the outdoors. Some feel more at home if they do not have to register for Mass. Whatever it takes to keep you connected to Christ, while staying safe, is what we will continue to do.

9:30 Sunday Mass in Church – This will continue to be our extra-precautions/Seraphim Mass.

Reservations are required. Ushers will guide you to the next available seat.

11:30 Sunday Mass – For now, this will continue to be our standard-precautions/Cherubim Mass. You need reservations if (a) you want a weather-proof seat under the tent or (b) you want one of the "infield parking spaces." You DO NOT need a reservation if you are willing to bring your own chair and sit in one of the specially reserved outdoor spots. (We only had a few people choose this option last week. I thought it would be crowded with people who wanted the altar before them and the sunshine on their shoulders.

8:35 daily Mass – No RSVP required M, Tu, Th, & Fri. Just show up, sign in, and find a socially distant seat.

Tuesday Evening (5:30) Communion Services — The least worrisome way to hear the Word and receive the Body of Christ. N.B. – **The Tuesday evening service switches to 5:30 for the month of October and then moves to Saturday morning for November through April.**

Wednesday Morning (10:00) Communion Services – This service is staying put at 10:00 am until the pandemic ends.

UPCOMING OPPORTUNITIES to HEAR THE WORD & RECEIVE COMMUNION with OTHERS – In addition to our current offerings, we hope to provide options that make it even easier to get to church.

4:45 Saturday Mass in Church – As soon as we get all caught up on First Communions, Confirmations, and Baptisms, we will again welcome a congregation back to the 4:45 Mass. October 24 currently stands out as the most likely date to resume this Mass, again. It will be a standard-precautions/Cherubim Mass. Two large unknowns are shaping the outlook for this Mass. First, will there be sufficient demand to justify the number of helpers required? (I hope so.) Second, can we round up enough helpers?

WE NEED "CHURCHWARDENS" – Our Anglican brethren and sistren have an effective monopoly on the term but we can borrow it for a bit and tweak it. We need people who, during the pandemic, can help us do some of the extra work that the pandemic requires. When the pandemic ends, the position will cease. Right now we need parishioners who can: (a) help to direct traffic at the upcoming Saturday morning Communion Services, (b) help people find seats at the 11:30 and, even more so, at the 4:45, (c) run the fogging machine after every Mass (takes two people who can spare 30-40 minutes), and (d) help move equipment back and forth before and after the 11:30 Mass. does not involve a long-term commitment to join a particular ministry. It means being one of the extra sets of hands we need while the pandemic continues. If you can help, please email Suzanne Kral at skral@stjosephsparish.com Thank you very much.

CONFIRMATIONS – God bless the 14 young people who will be confirmed at tomorrow morning's two services – one at 9 and one at 12. God bless you, your parents, your sponsors, and your teachers.

BAPTISMS – We are almost there. We have almost all the waiting babies scheduled for baptisms on Saturdays, October 10, and October 24.

RESPECT LIFE MONTH – October is "Respect Life Month." The "Life Chain" on October 4 kicks it all off. The Life Chain will take place at Mountain and Somerset in Somerville, near Immaculate Conception, from 2:00 to 3:30 on Sunday, October 4.

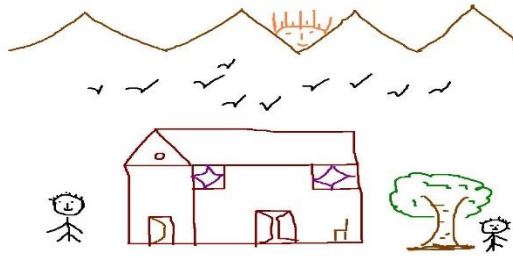
Immaculata High School FALL ADMISSIONS EVENTS

Emergency Rental Relief

Did you have a COVID-related financial impact that left you unable to pay your rent since April 2020?

If so, you may be eligible for assistance to pay the rent that is owed to your landlord from the

SOMERSET COUNTY CDBG-CV EMERGENCY RENTAL RELIEF PROGRAM

In order to be eligible, you must:

- Be a resident of any Somerset County municipality (except Franklin Township) and have a current lease or rent agreement.
- Have a household income that is less than the following income limits, based on family size:
1 Person \$66,900 2 People \$76,500 3 People \$86,100
4 People \$95,600 5 People \$103,200 6 People \$110,900
- *Be able to prove that your rent payments were current as of March 2020.
- Provide documentation of a COVID-related loss of income after March 9, 2020.

Examples include:-

Layoff or Reduced work hours –

Unpaid leave to take care of children due to school and daycare closure –

Self-quarantine for 14 days resulting in a loss of income –

Other consequence of the virus that led to a reduction of income
