

This Moment in Prayer, Service and Community

Dear All: Christ's Peace!

Monday, October 19, we celebrate the Feast of Saint Isaac Jogues and the North American Martyrs, the seven French Jesuit missionaries who labored here in the 17th century. Three of them — Jogues, Goupil, and LaLande — were martyred near Albany, New York. The other four — Brebeuf, Chabanal, Daniel, and Garnier — lost their lives near Midland, Ontario. Goupil died in 1642. All the others were killed between 1646 and 1649.

Saint Isaac, who was born and raised in France, was very much at home on the water. He paddled his missionary canoe, round trip, from Montreal to Minnesota. He traversed Lake George and called it "The Lake of the Blessed Sacrament." A few years back, when my college roommates and I would swim across the lake, we frequently visited the island where Isaac reportedly rested. Saint Isaac was the first priest to set foot on Manhattan island. And even though his journals provide no justification of this conjecture, I have always figured he saw New Jersey with his own eyes. I mean, how could you sail out of New Amsterdam harbor and NOT see Monmouth County's hills?

Isaac's consuming dedication to the mission inspires me daily. I think of him as a dear friend in heaven who loves and helps the people of our Milstone mission. Until this year, I had a hard time grasping the extent to which the pandemic of his day shaped his evangelization efforts. I am starting to get it.

Sorry to go on so long, but I love this guy and trust that he intercedes plenty. Perhaps you have noticed that at (just about) every Mass, I invoke him right after petitioning Our Lady of the Way and Saint Joseph. Maybe this will be the year I journey back to his beloved ravine on the day of the feast. Enjoy it!

This Moment in Prayer

OUR "MASS BOOK" – ARRANGING MASS IN-TENTIONS – If you have lost a child, you get to the front of the intentions line. If you have suffered this

tragedy, and would like to arrange a Mass, for your child's birthday or anniversary of death, please contact Carol in the front office next week. The Mass book will open to all parishioners on November 3, the day after All Souls' Day.

BAPTISMS – Saturday brought great happiness to our parish. GREAT blessings for the five babies baptized on Saturday and for their families. Blessings too for those to be baptized on the 24th.

FIRST COMMUNIONS – Perhaps you participated in Saturday's 4:45 livestreamed Mass? The one at which four beautiful youngsters made their First Communions, crossing the threshold from "Catholic little kids" to plain old "Catholic kids." They have been prepared beautifully and looked beautiful. May these First Communions mark the start of a long and greatly blessed relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist.

CONFESSIONS (OR CONVERSATION) – There are still two slots open for confessions tomorrow – Saturday, October 17. Email me if you want to claim one of them. Remember, you can reserve a slot even if you do not want to use it for confession. We can use the 20 minutes to discuss any spiritual or personal issue. Also, if you want to schedule confession for another time, of course we can do that.

LITURGY SCHEDULE - UPCOMING

CHANGES – I came remarkably close to thinking we had it all figured out. Then some parishioners made some helpful suggestions. For now, let's identify what will not change and what will.

WHAT IS NOT CHANGING – (i) The 9:30 Sunday Mass will not change. It is a "Seraphim/extra precautions" Mass. (ii) 8:35 Daily Mass will not change. It is standard precautions M, Tu, Th and F and extra precautions on W. (iii) Wednesday Communion Service will not change. It will stay at 10:00 am.

WHAT IS CHANGING – (i) The 11:30 outdoor Mass will be celebrated for four more weeks. It is a standard precautions Mass with unique reservations requirements. We are trying to determine if we should have 11:30 Mass indoors when the outdoor season ends. (ii) Tuesday Evening Communion Service will change. Blame it on the early sunsets. Our current best guess is that we will start having a Communion Service on Saturday mornings at 10 – starting November 7. (iii) Saturday 4:45 Mass will probably re-re-start soon. If, in addition to the 9:30 Mass (extra precautions) we are going to have one additional Mass (standard precautions), should it be on Saturday at 4:45 or Sunday at 11:30?
