

Dear All: Christ's Peace!

O HOLY NIGHTS

The planning for O HOLY NIGHTS made great strides this week. We can now share more details about church events that, we trust, will insert marvelous, unforgettable lights into our jumbled pandemic Christmas.

Weekly "Candle" Lighting and Prayer – We will gather at 4:30 every Advent Sunday, near the flagpole, to light the week's five-foot Advent "candle". The prayer service will last for a little more than 10 minutes. It will include some socially distant caroling, a bit of scripture, a bit of reflection and some more singing.

Weekly Special Events. – Following the Candle lighting, each week will offer one special event.

November 29 – The Grand Lighting of our 101 (+ a few more) sponsored trees.

December 6 – The walk in the woods, along our illuminated Prayer Path. to a life-sized creche.

December 13 – Outdoor caroling, and all the Christmas gladness that entails.

December 20 – The live creche and other Joyful Mysteries – with live farm animals.

Weekly Regular Events – For each of these four evenings, there will be winter refreshments served from the parish food truck. Also, the 101 trees will be illuminated every Sunday night. You will want to mosey along the tree row to take in the decorations and the dedications.

Our 101 Trees – We were able to settle on several important dates this week.

Tree Installation – Thanks to the many who have agreed to help install the trees. We will roll up our sleeves on Saturday, November 28 at 9 am. There will be two work teams. One that meets from 9 to noon. The other works from noon to three. The goal is to pound the rebar into the ground, attach the trees to the rebar, and get the power to each tree. Please email Bob Ferretti or use this form to sign up for one of the work teams.

Tree-light Installation – With luck, this will happen on the afternoon of Saturday the 28th. Each tree will get four strings of lights – white or colors, depending on the request.

Sign installation – Also scheduled for November 28 – signs indicating each tree's sponsor.

Tree decorating – Decorate your tree whenever it is convenient to do so – any time after 3 pm on Saturday the 28th. Remember, the Grand Lighting is the next day at 4:45.

Other Christmas Topics -

Special Access – Yes, we will set up times and ways for special access. People who need to stay in their cars will be able to take it all in. The one exception is the Walk in the Woods.

Books – Yes, through the generosity of two folks, we will be giving out another book this year.

Santa's Village – Yes, there will be all sorts of Santa stuff on each Sunday night. A lot.

Holy Family – We will have a fun, low-key special family event after the 11:30 Communion Service Mass on Sunday, December 27 – The Feast of the Holy Family

Epiphany – We will also do something fun after the 11:30 Communion Service on Sunday, January 3, the Feast of the Epiphany. The event will involve at least one of the following – gold, frankincense, myrrh, camels.

This Moment in Prayer

ADDED PRECAUTIONS AT THE 9:30 – Thanks to everyone who does their bit to keep the 9:30 Mass a "Seraphim Mass" with enhanced precautions. The 9:30 will stay that way. Thanks for understanding.

One of those added precautions . . . there is no moving about once you sit. If you need to leave your chair, which I hope you do not, you need to leave the church. People on chemo and other vulnerable folks like knowing that no one will walk near them during Mass. We can understand their concerns.

Remember that the 11:30 is standard precautions and the 4:45 will be too. If you or your children might need to move around, you will for sure be more at home at the 4:45 or the 11:30.

One of our parishioners tested positive two days after being at last Sunday's 9:30. That parishioner wore a mask the entire time, stayed socially distant at every moment, and never moved around during Mass. There is no reason to suspect that the person was a danger to anyone in church. I thank that person for honoring the enhanced precautions/Seraphim guidelines.

On Wednesday, the church was again deep cleaned and chemically treated. The process kills the virus on hard surfaces and lasts for three months. In addition, we are fogging the church after each Mass.

LITURGY SCHEDULE - UPCOMING

CHANGES – Our weekend schedule remains unchanged this weekend (11-14/15). Starting next weekend, Saturday 11/21, we will have Mass on Saturday at 4:45 (standard precautions/Cherubim) AND Sunday at 9:30 (enhanced precautions/Seraphim). Starting 11/22, we will also have a Communion Service in the parking lot at 11:30.

OUR ADVENT GIVING TREE – The drive ended last night, and by all indications, it was a great success. Think for a moment of how good you are. You recognized the need and responded. The new system required you to adjust and you did so beautifully. Who is better than you? Great big thanks to our Advent Giving Tree Ministry. Your dedication and ingenuity enable all of us to help those who need it most.
