Dear All:

Christ's Peace!

How good are you? Remarkably so. Be sure to let several of the following updates remind you of that. Also, be sure to check out the new schedule that comes into play this weekend – and remember you need to make reservations for Sunday's Communion Service. This week only, you can do that until Saturday night.

This Moment in Prayer

The New Liturgy Schedule – Our winter schedule begins this weekend. Our goal is to provide a safe, welcoming way for every parishioner to come together to hear the Word and receive Christ's Body. We strive to provide something for every variety of concern about the virus. The same is true for confessions.

Confessions – Parking Lot: Saturday morning by appointment with Fr Hank. Easily arranged.

(NB – On Thanksgiving weekend, confessions will be on Friday morning rather than Saturday morning, because the trees are being installed.)

Seraphim Mass/Enhanced Precautions – Every Sunday at 9:30, in church. Reservations are required. Temperatures are taken. Everyone, regardless of age, is required to stay in her or his chair throughout Mass. All standard precautions are also in place (masks, social distancing, Communion at departure). The Wednesday weekday Mass also uses enhanced precautions.

Cherubim Mass/Standard Precautions – Every Saturday at 4:45, in church. Neither temps nor reservations are involved. Masks, social distancing, and Communion at departure are required. The Mon, Tue, Thu and Fri daily Masses use standard precautions.

Communion Services – Every Wednesday at 10 and Sunday at 11:30 – For the foreseeable future, we will offer Communion Services at these two times. **For now, reservations are required**. We might drop that practice in a few weeks. Everyone stays in their cars. There is no contact with other parishioners. The day's gospel and the rest of the sound come through your car's FM radio. Ministers bring Communion to your car. NB – This weekend we switch from facing south toward the trailer to facing north toward our newly renovated prairie schooner (to be named soon). Thanks for always cooperating with our traffic folk. The service takes 15-20 minutes. Distribution of Communion takes another ten.

O Holy Nights

The Trees – You sponsored all 100+ of them and then some. Quickly. Wow.

Installation – You have answered the call. We need only a few more helpers in the afternoon of Saturday, Nov 28.

Tree Decorating – ANY time after 3 pm on Saturday 11/28. Do it up!

The Grand Lighting – Sunday, 11/29, right after the 4:30 Prayer Service. Be there!

Outdoor Advent Prayer Services – Every Sunday at 4:30. NB – Traffic stops during the 15-minute Service. It includes a bit of scripture, song, reflection, and connection despite the distances.

ADVENT GIVING TREE - You tilted the kindness meter. Severely. Per requests from the agencies we help, we needed 650 gift cards. You either donated or funded 862. This means an extra pair of boots for a youngster in the Appalachians, a complete Christmas dinner for a family in Camden, a real wool coat for a resident of an Arc group home in New Brunswick. You get it. Your gifts will provide Christmas for old people who are alone, young people living in poverty, people with significant disabilities, people recovering from addictions, families escaping abuse, and on and on. God bless every last one of you who helped. God bless each who wanted to help but was not in a position to do so this year. And gigantic thanks to Carol Jorgensen and Dianne Speronello who, along with our Social Ministries staff, managed the project. You did a superb job.

THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE – As of Thursday, you had provided Thanksgiving dinners for over 200 families. The Memorial Hallway, lined with a triple row of shopping bags from end to end, has never looked more inspiring. Compared to the Advent Giving Tree cards, the food is dispersed over a relatively small area. Folk in our county and immediately adjacent counties will benefit the most. Warning – start wondering how you will react when Christ our King looks at you and says, "when you did it for the least of mine, you did it for me." Parishioners from our Youth Ministry and our Social Ministries groups have been organizing and distributing the food and the gift cards.
