

Dear Parishioners,

The response to the "101 Trees of Light" project has been extremely robust. I am once again amazed but not terribly surprised.

The very strong response to the project presents us with a question we are fortunate to face: given the government limit of 150 people at outdoor events, how can we include everyone who wants to participate in "O Holy Nights"?

After entertaining several options, the staff and I have decided on a three-part solution that promises, we believe, to accommodate the greatest number of people.

First, we will have two sessions every Sunday evening. The early one starts at 4:30. The later one starts at 6:30.

Second, we will use the same sort of registration system that has enabled us to maximize participation at Sunday Masses.

Third, we will illuminate the trees Friday through Tuesday evenings from 6 pm to 9 PM. These evening sessions allow people to enjoy it all even if they cannot exit their vehicles.


