

This Moment in Prayer, Service and Community

Dear All: Christ's Peace!

The lights on the 100+ trees are on every night from 4:30-10:00 pm. Come and enjoy!

What say you?

Our "O Holy Nights" events are all mapped out. Judging by last week's turnout and the current registrations for upcoming events, the response will continue to be very strong.

But here is the challenge. The statewide spike in infections has prompted the governor to reduce outside gatherings, starting Monday, to a maximum of 25. This Sunday is not a problem. We can still have 150 folks at both the 4:30 and 6:30 sessions. Scores of people will be able to enjoy our remarkably beautiful, prayerful, and fun "Shepherd's Path." The evenings of caroling and the live nativity might have to change.

Several considerations come into play. Because they are church gatherings, our events are exempt from the attendance limits. We could, in theory, have hundreds of people here. But what about the gap between "can" and "should." Life is full of pursuits we can undertake but should not.

I, who tend to go overboard on the safety concerns, am not overly concerned about the safety factor. We are all outdoors. Everyone is wearing masks. And, judging by last week, people are doing a great job of social distancing. "Safety" is not the question. "Example" seems to be the most pressing question.

In this, as in all things, we want to "know what Jesus wants, want what Jesus wants, and do what

Jesus wants." We discern which example Jesus wants us to set. As with all discernment processes, we specify our options. We enjoy three: full steam ahead, bag it, go to Plan B. And as with all discernment processes, we try to identify those things that keep us from knowing, wanting and doing what Jesus wants. Are we so invested that we stop asking what Jesus wants? Are we so concerned about the virus that we stop asking?

Each option (full steam, bag it, Plan B) provides an example for our parishioners and others. And so, I ask you, "What say you in the matter of 'O Holy Nights' for December 13 and 20: full steam ahead, bag it, or Plan B?" Before you propose a solution, please list at least one positive and one negative example that each option generates. Then, as we do in all discernments, imagine yourself standing before Jesus (during His public ministry), telling Him of your decision. Try it with each option. Which brings you the most peace?

Overthinking? Maybe. Good practice? For sure. I know what I want Him to want me to want, but that is not how it works. What say you in the matter of O Holy Nights? Have fun discerning and discussing.

This Moment in Prayer

"O Holy Nights" – The Shepherds' Path – The scene is set and it is fantastic – and it will be fun and safe. Once again, shared prayer will be at 4:30 and 6:30. Then walk the path, enjoy the 100+ trees, and enjoy the world's best cocoa. Remember to wear sturdy shoes you don't mind getting a little dirty. And bring a flashlight. Also, all masks all the time! How about for a week or three, you consider yourself all caught up on parish-sponsored service? Good for you!

This Moment in Community

Our Volunteers: Profiles in Generosity – Consider just a few of the projects that are working beautifully because our church abounds with largehearted, generous volunteers.

Both of Sunday Evening's "O Holy Night" sessions relied on about 50 volunteers – to run the food truck, plug in the lights, direct traffic, play music, check names, distribute books and wreaths, and clean up.

The clearing of the "Shepherd's Path" occurred because about 25 people showed up with chain saws, shovels, clippers, rakes, leaf blowers, compasses, and great attitudes.

The distribution of Christmas gifts to 98 of our mobility-limited and/or senior parishioners has been a success because 25 folks agreed to play Santa to deliver the gifts. The responses have been heartwarming.

CCD is bubbling along (virtually) because nearly 60 adults are either teaching or doing the background work required to run a large-scale virtual program.

We can conduct Communion Services and celebrate Mass because dozens of people are serving as traffic directors, temperature takers, foggers, sacristans, and safety managers.

The place looks like it does because 100 volunteers installed the trees and the lights and nearly 100 families have come to decorate the trees.

The list goes on. This pandemic continues to elicit adventures that reveal vast clouds of goodness.

Knights of Columbus – 'Tis the season to join. This is a very productive and very fun organization. During the pandemic, and on both sides of it, the Knights are the parish's "go-to-guys." They get it done for the parish and they have many hearty laughs while doing so. Our chapter is truly exceptional. I am looking forward to seeing you at one of our Eucharist events – and hoping many of you enjoy the shared prayer and the Shepherd's Path on Sunday night.
