# "Oh, Holy Nights"

This Sunday's "O Holy Night" will, as scheduled, be our night of caroling. Each registered group will get two parking spaces, a car-space and a peoplespace. The spaces will connect end-to end. If the weather is lousy, you might spend the whole time in your car. (N.B., our parish's FM radio station is now strong enough to deliver the music to the radio of every car in the lot.) If the weather is good, you might spend the entire time outdoors in your people-space. If you want to bring beach chairs, decorate your space, set up a tailgate situation, or bring a reindeer, great! We ask only that you stay in your two spaces. No milling about. No wandering from car to car. Feel free to bellow a greeting to distant singers, but no walking.

Between every pair of assigned spaces, there will be a pair of empty spaces. Think of this as noman's-land. The space is provided to make sure that there is always ten feet of social distance between parties. It is very important that we honor that social distance.

This configuration means we will have cars in only one-quarter of the spaces. Another quarter will be people-spaces and the other two quarters will be separation spaces. This calls for a bit of extra planning on everyone's part. Please consider the following:

Fill your car with as many people as you can who are in your quarantine bubble. Our strategy requires us to regulate the number of cars rather than number of people.

\*\*If you want to be adjacent to people who are not in your quarantine bubble, caravan with them to church. That way, you will enter the lot together and will be parked next to each other (across the separation spaces). We will not be able to hold adjacent spaces for later arrivals. That would require us to pay the ushers more.

\*\*Go to the restroom before you come to church! Remember, our parking spaces lack facilities! Also, bring a trash bag so you can remove your party trash. \*\*Refreshments, including the now-famous hot chocolate "St. Joe-co," will be delivered to your parking space. We are currently trying to train last week's shepherds how to roller skate while carrying trays of beverages and wearing elf hats.

\*\*This caroling event will be different and oh-so-excellent – regardless of the weather. Both sessions – the 4:30 and the 6:30 – will provide about 40 minutes of sing along, led by choir members in the hay wagon. It will also be oh-so-safe. ### From the Diocesan Office of Human Life & Dignity: **NEW JERSEY REPRODUCTIVE ACT**

On October 8, 2020, The Reproductive Freedom Act (RFA) S3030 was introduced in the New Jersey State Senate and was referred to the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee. If passed, the RFA would codify into New Jersey law the findings of Roe v. Wade, meaning that abortion would remain legal in New Jersey even if the case were overturned by the Supreme Court. The RFA would also strip safeguards and regulations on the abortion procedure, making New Jersey a more dangerous place for women and their unborn babies. The Assembly companion bill is A4848.

The Diocesan Office of Human Life & Dignity has been working closely with the New Jersey Catholic Conference (NJCC) on this issue to develop resources and monitor the bill. Here is the link to NJ Catholic Conference's updated Reproductive Freedom Act resource page:
