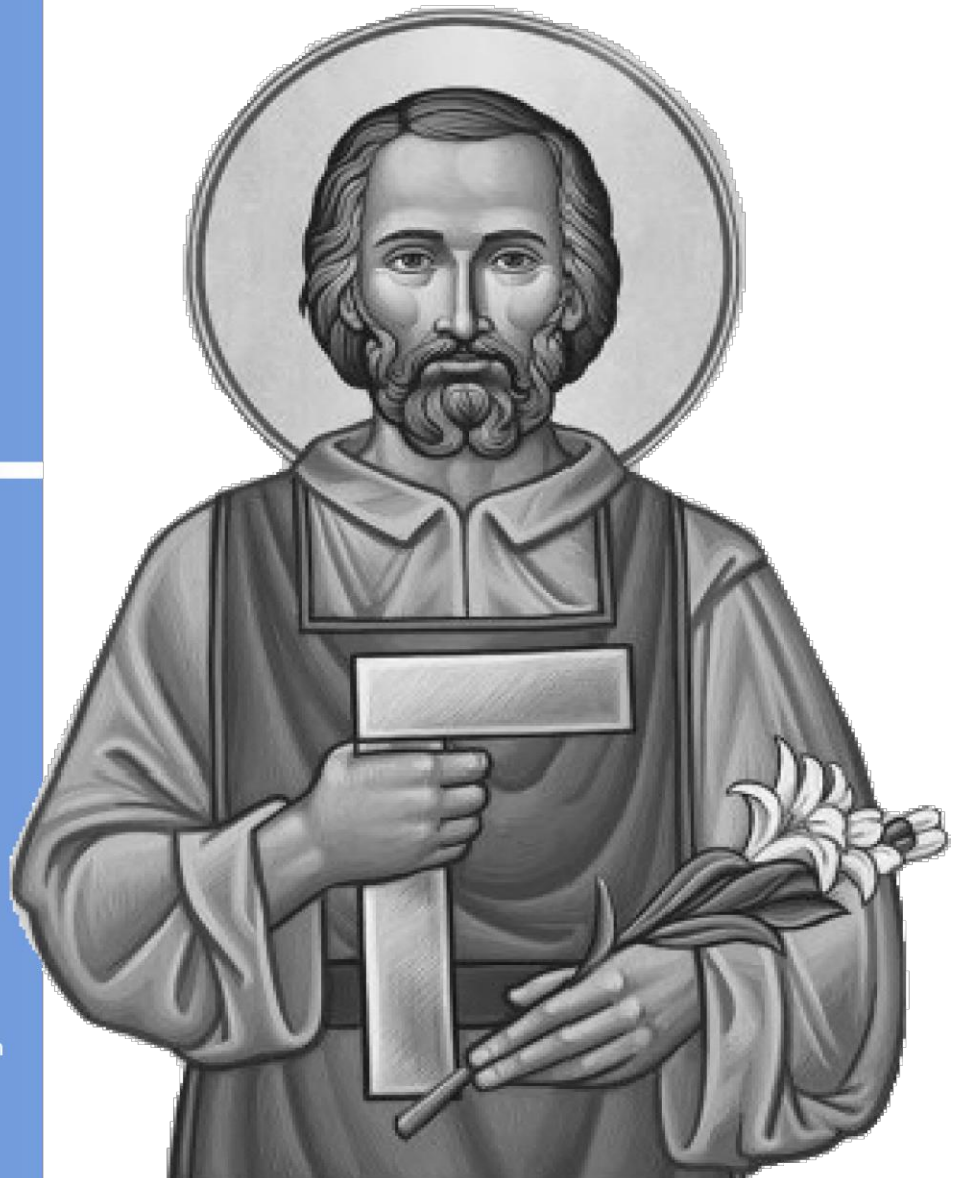

## *This Moment in Prayer, Service and Community*

Dear All: A word of thanks from me . . .

*Monday's Feast of the North American Martyrs blessed me with a good dose of wanderlust. For the first time in decades, on the feast itself, I was within reach of the Shrine of the North American Martyrs and had no carved-in-stone evening duties. Google Maps told me it was 213-miles away. The prospect of a 426-mile afternoon made me pause. But the better angels then prevailed. I hit the road right after lunch.*

*My first stop was a very brief hello at the Jesuit house in Cornwall, New York, "The Retreat of Saint Isaac Jogues". I shared a very cheery hello – masked and socially distant – with the great Jesuit pals I had not seen since before the pandemic closed their house to outsiders. The drive from Cornwall to Auriesville could not have been nicer. I reached the Ravine, for me the holiest ground at the Shrine, well before sunset.*

*Why am I using space in "This Week" to recount all this? Because it was a moment of peak gratitude for the privilege of being your pastor. Life at Saint Joe's generally leaves me feeling like the luckiest of ducks. Down in the Auriesville Ravine, reading Isaac's 1645 letters, re-experiencing his devotion, using his words to connect with Christ while, in the same moment, recalling the overwhelming goodness of our parishioners, especially during the pandemic, the sense of gratitude tilted my "thanks meter." I thank you for that. Truly.*

### *This Moment in Prayer*

**CALLING EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS** – The job descriptions for all ministries have been up for grabs since the pandemic started. Most sacristans serve as EMs. Ushers serve as sacristans. Everyone serves as a pack mule. Please email me if you can serve as an EM at the 11:30 Sunday Communion Services that start on November 22. It requires you to walk from car to car but does NOT require direct contact with communicants. Thanks in advance for the help.

**ARRANGING MASS INTENTIONS** – If you have lost a child, you get to the front of the intentions line. If you have suffered this tragedy, and

would like to arrange a Mass, for your child's birthday or anniversary of death, please contact Carol in the front office next week. The Mass book will then open to all parishioners on November 3, the day after All Souls' Day.

**BAPTISMS** – Saturday, October 24 – was another joyful day of baptisms. We welcomed six more babies into the faith. God bless all of them and their families.

**CONFESSIONS (OR CONVERSATION)** – Tomorrow's day of baptisms means that appointments for confession or conversation will get back on track next Saturday, October 31. No costumes required.

### **LITURGY SCHEDULE – UPCOMING CHANGES:**

**Parking Lot Communion Services** – The Wednesday morning, 10 am, will continue through the winter. This Tuesday, October 27, will be the last Tuesday evening service. That service will relocate to Sunday at 11:30 am.

**Masses** – The 9:30 Sunday Mass will not change. It will remain a "Seraphim/added precautions" Mass. The 11:30 outdoor Sunday Mass will be celebrated through November 15. We will take the roof off the tent the following day. Instead of that Mass, we will have an 11:30 Communion Service. The 4:45 Saturday Mass will resume on November 21 and will be a "Cherubim/standard precautions" Mass. The 8:35 Daily Mass will continue as is. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, it is a Cherubim/standard precautions Mass. Wednesday, it is a Seraphim/extra precautions Mass. Call Carol in the front office to reserve a seat for Wednesday.

### *This Moment in Community*

**HELLO VETERANS** – Our blessed tradition will not waiver! We will again honor all parish veterans in prayer and (appropriate) fellowship. We will celebrate a parking lot Communion Service at 1:30 pm on Sunday, November 15th. After Communion, we will continue the tradition of calling the roll. We will also distribute some very excellent knit goods that parishioners have been crafting since June. Of all the things we cannot let the pandemic interrupt, our Veterans' ceremony is high on the list. Please be sure to register, even if you cannot come.

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION** – Our CCD program entered its next phase of distance learning and all seems to have gone very well. Great thanks to the

**REACHING ISOLATED PEOPLE** – If you or any member of your family or extended community is feeling a bit isolated, please let me know. We want no one to enter the colder, darker months feeling alone. Are you aware of an older person who came to church all the time before the pandemic but is now staying home? Let me know. We want to reach out. Are you aware of an older person who has drifted away from church in recent years and is now spending most hours alone? Let me know. The response will be low-key and welcoming. PLEASE help us help folks find a deeper sense of community during the pandemic.

**THE IPAD PROJECT** – Tremendous thanks to all who donated used iPads. We now begin the task of showing isolated parishioners how to use them. This is a big deal. We asked for a few more than we currently need, precisely so we could help previously unknown people stay connected to church. Please let me know if you are aware of anyone who would like to come (virtually) to Mass and all else that goes on here.

**MEN'S BIBLE STUDY** – We start exploring Mark's gospel on Wednesday, November 4 at 7:30 pm. If you have expressed an interest in joining this adventure, you should have heard from Suzanne Kral, who is managing the roster. Please let me know if you have not contacted her. It should be a very good class.

**FOGGING MINISTRY** – Think "Ghostbusters." It's a pretty fun look. Get in on the project. We could still use a few folks to fog the church after Mass – especially after the 4:45, once it gets going.
