The following will be distributed outdoors and will involve no person-to-person contact:

- After the 10:00 AM Communion Service in the parking lot
- During the 5:00 PM Service of Ashes in the parking lot (registration required)
- Between 7:00 and 8:00 pm, by Fr. Hank, in front of the church, drive-up

Also, at every service, ashes will be distributed with Q-tips, not with thumbs. There will be no person-to-person contact

Dear All: Christ's Peace!

Get ready to say goodbye to the green. Wednesday moves us into 40 days of purple. Then comes fifty days of white. We return to the green on Monday, May 24. It will surely be a different world.

Our Lenten Conversions – What positive habit is God asking you to embrace? What negative habit is God asking you to abandon? Have you had a chance to think through how you might use Lent to launch these changes? Perhaps you can relate to my pattern of having lots of good ideas and then suddenly it is Ash Wednesday. We still have a few days. And maybe let pandemic experiences influence your choices.

Prayer to Saint Joseph – Pope Francis has announced the year of Saint Joseph. Since he is our parish patron, this is an extra-special time for us. Between March 19 (The Feast of Saint Joseph the Husband of Mary) and May 1 (The Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker), we will say a brief prayer to Saint Joseph after each Mass. But here is the problem; I cannot recall the very pithy Saint Joseph prayer of my youth. We want to keep it short so that we can remember it and use it when we need it. We are less on the search for something like the Memorare and more on the search for something like "Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, Bless the bed that I lay on, and if I die before I wake, I pray the Lord my soul to take." Suggestions?

Spring Sacraments — We are ready to get going! It will be different and oh-so-excellent and grace-filled.

First Penances – We have 39 students making First Penances – in small groups, with their parents, on Saturday mornings in March. **First Communions** – We have 46 youngsters making their First Communions in late April and early May. Most will be at special Masses. A few will be at regularly scheduled Masses.

Confirmations – In early June, on Friday nights and/or Saturday mornings, I will have the privilege of confirming 79 young people.

Once again, it will be a season of remarkable and very memorable graces.

Our Parish Necrology – If you didn't get a chance to submit your edits, no big worries. We will be updating every year. Meanwhile – HUGE thanks to Sean Glennon for getting it all done. It takes the skill and generosity of a Saint Peter's Prep guy to do this!

Youth Group Rosary — on Sunday evening Feb 21 the youth group will be saying the rosary together and offering up intentions for the people of the parish. After the praying, they will "party like it's 2021"...socially distant...with chicken and sides from TLG.

1000 Bottles of Soap on the Wall, a Thousand Bottles of Soap – (dish soap and laundry soap, that is) – It is once again time for our early Lent effort to help the Feeding Hands Food pantry. (N.B. – The pantry recently moved from Somerville to larger quarters in Raritan.) Our goal is to provide 1,000 bottles of laundry soap and 1,000 bottles of dish soap. Thanks to our Knights for organizing this project and for clarifying the guidelines:

Every bottle should contain 32 or fewer ounces

Make your contribution between Sunday, March 7 and Good Friday, April 2

Put your contributions in the specially marked bins in the church van

If the van is out delivering food, leave the bottles in the bin on the bench by the door

Send up a prayer for the recipients when you buy the soap, when you drop it off, or both.

Hillsborough Food Bank – Thanks to all who inquired this week about last week's announcement concerning package size. Once again, you are doing a terrific job, and everyone involved appreciates your effort to obtain and contribute smaller packages.

Valentines for Parish Caregivers – So many of our parishioners give themselves selflessly to caring for loved ones who need extra help. Our parish's Ministry to Caregivers serves these folks in

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

So that the Church of Metuchen may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese who enjoy the blessings of good health:

1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

3. From the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the Easter fast should be observed so that, with uplifted and welcoming hearts, we may be ready to celebrate the joys of the Resurrection.

This ancient tradition, intimately connected with the Rites of Holy Week and the Order of

Christian Initiation of Adults, is encouraged, especially in those places baptizing catechumens at the Easter Vigil.

The obligation to fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. To fast in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger.

The obligation of abstinence affects all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat. The obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered a grave matter. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.
