The pandemic keeps us from using holy water – a rich symbol of our baptisms and of God's care – in church, but we can use it at home. Use it well!

- Install it by the door through which you most frequently exit your home.
- Bless yourself with the sign of the cross each time you pass it.
- After making the sign of the cross, recite the Jesus Prayer,
- "Lord Jesus Christ, Living Son of the Living God, thank you for X, help me with Y."
- Emphasize the "living" in each phrase.
- Let X be a gift you have received during the pandemic.
- Let Y be a part of your life where you need God's grace to reach a sense of fuller vitality.
- Keep it up until Pentecost.
- Stand still while you are doing it.




