This Moment in Prayer, Service and Community

Dear All: Christ'[s Peace! Thís Moment ín Prayer

Holy Water at Home – As you refill your home font, what should you do when holy water in the bottle starts to run out? I rely on you to update me here, but the following matches my understanding. Bottom line? Add bits of water along the way, well before your bottle gets to the 50 percent mark:

The common custom (though not officially recognized) is that so long as the water added to the holy water does not amount to half the amount of the holy water then all water in the container is considered blessed water.

11:30 Mass: Seating – With glory and thanks to God, we resume the "11:30 Tent Mass" on Sunday. You do not need to register for this Mass. There will be three seating options: under the tent (the weather-proof seats), in the outdoor enclosure (the sunny seats), and in your car (the radio seats). All seats will be filled on a first-come-first-served basis.

11:30 Mass: Parking – You can park in one of four places. PLEASE PRINT – LOUD AND CLEAR ON BIG PAPER – which of the following you prefer. AND SHOW IT TO THE USHER ON THE WAY IN. By making your word visible to the folks at the gate, you will speed things along and reduce the probability of mishaps!

Volunteer: You park next to the tent in rows 1-4. In-car: If, for health reasons, you choose to remain in your car, you will be parking in rows 5-9, on the church side of those rows, facing the tent. Cars will be arranged "checkerboard style" to facilitate the distribution of Communion. Since the altar is under the tent, you will not see as much as you did at the Communion Services. But the audio will be just as good. Tune in to 88.7 FM. If you are staying in your car because you are lazy, shape up and relocate!

Close: If you will be sitting in the tent or the enclosure, but have mobility issues, you will be parking in rows 5-9, on the flagpole side of the lot. That puts you very close to the tent.

General: If you are none of the above, you will park in rows 10-19, anywhere you would like. And

for being so easy, your car will be simonized and tire-shined when you return. (Actually, that is not true.) It would be great if you walk to the tent on the driveway by the church.

We are doing our best to accommodate as many as possible. We will live and learn and adjust our tactics as needed.

11:30 Mass: Communion – If you are sitting in the tent or the enclosure, you will receive Communion on your way out . We might start from the back. Or from the front. Stay tuned. Safety is the goal. If you are in your car, for health reasons, a Eucharistic Minister will come to your car after everyone else has received Communion. Please open your window, make sure your mask is in place, extend your arms as far as possible, and form your palms into a deep bowl to receive the Body of Christ.

Safe Departures – from the 10:00 Wednesday Communion Services and 11:30 Sunday Masses – I apologize again to those at whom I have barked! And remember, the barking will continue until the stopping stops! I am more eager than you can imagine to connect with each of you, as I was able to do pre-pandemic in front of the church. Regrettably, there is no safe way for you to slow or stop to chat on the way out. That is why, when you stop and roll down your window, I respond with "Keep Moving!" If you have something to deliver or a message to share, just wait in your space until everyone has left, then we can gab it up! Thanks.

Upcoming Mass Changes – Once again, with glory and thanks to God, the number of people attending Mass in-person is rising steadily. I believe that the current setup – 4:45 Saturday (standard precautions), 9:30 Sunday (enhanced precautions) and 11:30 Sunday (outdoors) – will enable everyone who wants to go to Mass to go to Mass. The story might change by the time Pentecost rolls around. Expect some tweaks.

Honor Thy Ushers – Thanks over and over and over for your exemplary cooperation. Since God enabled us to reopen our church, you have been great sports. In the next few weeks, so we can accommodate increasing numbers of people, the ushers will gradually become a bit more directive and will rely, even a bit more, on your good natures. Please keep the following guidelines in mind:

Assemble Outdoors – If you and your intended pew-mates are coming in separate cars, meet each other outside and then come in. The ushers seat people in order of arrival.

Stay put at the 9:30 – The 9:30 is meant to accommodate people who have health concerns but

want to come to Mass indoors. People who are particularly vulnerable feel safer when they minimize exposure. So, if you need to leave your seat at the 9:30, feel free to stay in the Gathering Space to participate in the rest of the Mass. Folks at the 9:30 enjoy just one arrival at their seats!

Keep Cooperating with the Ushers – You have been doing a terrific job of staying focused on the common good. Now, as we head slowly out of the pandemic and, as pandemic fatigue increases, it is understandable that people want to return to pre-pandemic autonomy. That will happen. As we find our ways toward that old way, I very much appreciate your cooperation with the ushers, especially as they direct you to seats that might not be your first choice. They are responsible for keeping people safe and maximizing numbers. I am grateful for your suggestions and for your willingness to share them with me rather than via the ushers.
