

FLOOD RELIEF – CATHOLIC CHARITIES – This week's second collection is for Catholic Charity's efforts to help flood victims. HITTING PAUSE ON OUR COLLECTIONS – We had hoped to collect \$20,000 of new donations to reach our overall goal of \$50,000 of assistance funds. Of that \$20,000, we have so far collected \$76,744. This stupendous expression of generosity has prompted me to make an unusual request. Except for your contribution to this week's second collection for Catholic Charities, I humbly and respectfully ask that you stop giving, for now. Before we receive any more donations to the Parish Disaster Fund, we need to reconfigure our giving strategy. Only you . . .

DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS – Already Given – Two parish families needed significant and immediate help because of severe health challenges and significant flood damage. They now have new furnaces, hot water heaters, cleaned-out basements, and no wet sheetrock. Both homes can now accommodate a family with health challenges. This Week – Jeanine and her helper have completed five home visits, heard the families' stories, and made assessments. Our Assistance Advisory Board will review their findings and recommend grant levels within the week. Next Week - Twelve more parish families are submitting requests and arranging visits. Next Month - On October 1, we will start to review requests from (a) our Millstone neighbors, (b) parishioners from Christ the Redeemer in Manville, and (c) a few others. When we feel we have heard from most of the parishioners who are going to apply, we will reassess our plans for helping SHIP and Feeding Hands. We also realize, having lived through Florence, Irene, Sandy and others, that the restoration takes time and produces many financial surprises. The funding will be available through 2022. Please keep encouraging flood victims to let the parish help. And, if you have not already done so, please give us permission to redeploy your Covid gift to the disaster fund.


