



Dear All, Christ's Peace!

Your Personal Lenten Discipline – The universal church's Lenten tradition is to intensify our practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. I encourage you to honor that tradition by initiating long-term changes you believe Jesus wants you to make. Have you thought of using Lent as a motivator to change habits?

Jesus' "To-do List" for You – Can you name one good habit you think Jesus wants you to adopt during Lent? In prayer, fasting, or almsgiving? In ways that help you to become the priest/prophet/king-queen Jesus invites you to become?

Jesus' "To-quit List" for You – And what about Jesus' "to-quit list" for you? Can you name one bad habit you think Jesus wants you to drop? Maybe it has to do with physical health (quit this excess) or mental health (quit this excessive worry) or spiritual help (quit multitasking during prayer). What other habit might He be asking you to drop?

Financial Peace? – Might Jesus be encouraging you to take up a good financial habit or put down a bad financial habit – all for the glory of God and the good of your loved ones? Think about it. If financial adjustments might be a good Lenten project for you, take advantage of the parish's access to the free, do-it-yourself version of Financial Peace University.

Our Community Lenten Practices – As a community, we will make a number of Lenten adjustments.

Preparation for Communion – Starting Wednesday, at all Masses, we will pray a parish "Prayer Before Receiving Communion." It is our version of a worthy spiritual practice encouraged by, among many others, Saint Anselm, Saint Thomas, Saint Hildegard, and Saint Jane. The words will be printed on large cards in the hymnals and on small cards for you to take home. The words will also be presented to those participating via livestream.

Confessions – During Lent, we will have the usual Saturday morning options and more hours during the week by appointment. Has it been a while? So what? Try it.

I send this with great blessings for you and your loved ones as we enter this very holy and grace-filled season.

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

So that the Church of Metuchen may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese who enjoy the blessings of good health:

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
- 3. From the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the Easter fast should be observed so that, with uplifted and welcoming hearts, we may be ready to celebrate the joys of the Resurrection. This ancient tradition, intimately connected with the Rites of Holy Week and the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, is encouraged, especially in those places baptizing catechumens at the Easter Vigil.

The obligation to fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. To fast in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger.

The obligation of abstinence affects all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.

The obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered a grave matter. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.

Saint Patrick's Day – This year, the feast falls on a Friday. Bishop Checchio says it is ok to eat corned beef (or other meat) that day and abstain from meat on another day that same week.

Have you thought much about your guardian angel since you prayed at bedtime when you were a kid? If not, maybe it's time to catch up with the one that's been assigned to help you. The word *angelos* means "messenger" in Greek, and since angels "always behold the face" of God in heaven (Matthew 18:10), they're well-positioned to intercede for you. Appreciate the watchful care that surrounds you and protects you from spiritual and perhaps physical dangers. Their constant attention indicates how precious you are to God and how active God wishes to be in your life.

Grigor Narekatsi, born near the turn of the first millennium, was an Armenian mystical and lyrical poet, monk, and theologian. He has the distinction of being venerated as a saint in the Armenian Apostolic and Catholic Churches and was declared a doctor of the church by Pope Francis in 2015. The prayer book of Gregory of Narek is a fixture in religious Armenian homes, second only to the Bible, and is considered a masterpiece of Christian spiritual literature. It has been translated into 30 languages, including English. Given the rave reviews, consider this writer-saint for your next read!

Get on board for justice

Today marks the 98th death anniversary of Homer Plessy, the man who attempted to end segregation with his legendary ride on a whites-only streetcar in New Orleans in 1892. His efforts were unsuccessful, and the following seven decades of U.S. jurisprudence included segregation as a bedrock feature. Plessy, however, is much less heralded for the fact that he was a man of faith, a black Catholic whose famous ride was organized by an interracial activist group known as the Comité des Citoyens (Citizens' Committee). Their holy disobedience was one of the first Catholic-led efforts against the

developing hierarchy of racism in the formerly French and Spanish regions of the Deep South. May the courage of Plessy and his allies be of use to us today as we continue the march toward justice.

Not long after, Katharine stunned society by leaving behind her privileged life to dedicate herself to religious life. She worked to improve living conditions and educational opportunities for African Americans and Native Americans. She left a legacy far greater than her family fortune.

While not a Bible figure or social media influencer, 15th-century Casimir of Poland happens to fit the categories of both saint and young person. But Casimir felt called to focus on prayer, study, and care for people in need. Although he had to contend with some very disappointed people, he stood firm in his decision to follow his calling. Disease cut short his life at the tender age of 25, but his example can inspire us to live out our calling and thus help fulfill his.
