

### Behind the Scenes of This Week's Readings

Today, the First Sunday of Advent, is the beginning of the new Liturgical Calendar. . Advent is taken from the Latin word *adventus* (coming), a translation of the Greek *parousia* (second coming). Most likely its observance began in the 4th century when the Church began to celebrate Christ's birth. It was a time of penance similar to Lent. It has lasted as long as five weeks and as short as 3 days a week. Most importantly, its early history focused on preparing for the Second Coming of Christ. Not until much later was a remembrance of Christ's birth added to the observance of Advent. Today Advent is four weeks long and celebrates both the remembrance of Christ's birth and the preparation for his Second Coming. To everyone's liking, it is not as penitential as Lent. – *Dorothy Gearon*

### CHANGES IN THE MASS SCHEDULE

### Sunday 6:00 PM Mass

This Sunday, November 20, will be our last 6:00 pm Mass. We have been averaging 40 people and most of the regular parishioners have indicated they can participate at another Mass. The change will eliminate significant pressure on those who schedule the ushers, sacristans, and lectors. The change also enables us to schedule special occasion Masses at that time – e.g., for the Youth Group, the SAGES, Social Ministries, etc. Thanks to all who have supported the 6:00 pm effort.

### Saturday at 8:35 AM

Our pre-pandemic schedule included Saturday morning Mass. During the pandemic, we started having confessions, anointings, and "open office hours" at that time. The new system works very well and we will stick to it. People who feel invited to receive Eucharist every day can still receive on Saturday evenings.

### **Multiple Mass Intentions at Every Mass**

By the grace of God, parishioners are becoming even more attentive to the needs of deceased loved ones. Over the last several years, requests for Mass intentions have risen from about 500 to more than 800. The schedule fills by early spring and we must turn people away for the next eight or nine months. We can arrange Mass intentions in the missions, and many people are fine with that. Still, many parishioners want to arrange Masses here. We have increased the number of Mass intentions by offering three intentions for the Masses on 8:35 Tuesday and 9:30 Sunday. We are now adding more. As of January 1, every Mass will allow up to three intentions. With the changes in the Mass schedule (see above), we are expanding the annual number of Mass intentions from roughly 800 a year to 1400 each year. We will try it for 2023 and assess the changes at this time next year. I hope this allows us to accommodate every request for a Mass intention for a loved one.

As *A Wrinkle in Time* tells us: "To love is to be vulnerable; and it is only in vulnerability and risk—not safety and security—that we overcome darkness."

### Be first to follow the Lord

It's no coincidence that Saint Andrew the Apostle is linked to Advent (which traditionally begins on the Sunday closest to his feast day). In Eastern Christianity he is known as *protokletos*, "first called," because it was Andrew, who had been a disciple of John the Baptist, who persuaded his brother Simon (whom we know as Peter) to follow Jesus with his words, "We have found the

Messiah!" Andrew also has a devotion linked to Advent, known as the Saint Andrew Novena. Try it out and see if it supports and deepens your living out your own call.

### **Build on higher ground**

Anyone who has followed the news over the past year has seen more images than ever of people coping with floods. Families waiting on rooftops, people stuffed in boats, neighbors wading through murky water. Jesus constantly used images to make his point, including the image of discipleship as a solid house that stands firm during storms and floods. "Be faithful in small things because it is in them that your strength lies," Saint Teresa of Calcutta once said. Are you building a strong, flood-proof house in the small things you do each day?

Today, the church remembers martyrs Jean Donovan, Maura Clarke, Dorothy Kazel, and Ita Ford, brutally murdered for standing with the poor in war-torn El Salvador in 1980. Their witness still speaks profoundly to us today as we encounter our own wars, violence, and suffering, especially among the most vulnerable. And still, we struggle to know what to do. Let us take courage as we ponder the questions posed by Ita Ford in 1977: "Am I willing to suffer with the people here, the suffering of the powerless? Can I say to my neighbors, 'I have no solution to this situation. I don't know the answers, but I will walk with you, search with you, be with you?"

### Missionizing begins at home

Many of the practices of the great "missionizing projects" of centuries past are seen as problematic in our age, with its greater sensibility of the rights of indigenous peoples to worship freely as they wish. So, while the legacy of one of the patrons of foreign missions, Saint Francis Zavier, is a mixed one, it is significant to note that he always provided for ongoing pastoral care of the communities he missionized and also advocated for an educated native clergy (rather than foreign-born leadership). None of us acts with perfect justice, but each of us finds ourself living in a unique historical moment, called upon to help church and society live up to the best and most noble qualities of our tradition.




