Dear All, Christ's Peace!

**Gigantic thanks** and blessings for all who worked so hard to make our Holy Week Masses and prayers so beautiful. If you are one of those generous souls who did anything to help the cause, God bless you extra!

**The 7-Ds Theme** – Several people have asked for a list of the “Seven Ds,” the d-words that turn us to God to ask for help in reaching deeper belief in Christ’s presence in the communion. We might ask God for: fewer Distractions during Mass, less of the self-Doubt that makes it hard to believe God wants to give us something so astonishing, Deeper views of what happens during Mass, the habit of Doubling back to contemplate the gifts of Communion, a more robust response to Disappointments that can weaken my desire for Jesus, a bit less of the Dilettante spirit that gives me a sometimes commitment to Christ, and a greater appreciation of Jesus’s Devotion to all of us.

**Pavilion** – I have mentioned the pavilion proposal several times over the last several months. It is now time to get specific about it. Why now? It made little sense to get into the details until the project became possible. Two things had to happen before we could call it “possible.” First, the diocesan consultors had to approve the proposal. They did so in January. Second, Millstone Borough had to approve the proposal. They did so last Tuesday. Now that it is a possibility, we need to decide if it should happen. Starting April 23, a model of the pavilion will be in the Gathering Space. There will also be letters that explain the project’s logic, logistics and how we as a parish will decide if we should pursue the project. Thanks in advance for giving the project your prayerful consideration – and for asking Jesus to help us to know, want, and do what He wants.

**Parishioners** – If you have registered in the last year or plan to register soon, please join us for our New Parishioner Welcome on Sunday, May 7 in the Hospitality Room right after the 11:30 Mass. Come and meet your fellow parishioners, enjoy a light lunch, learn about the parish and ways to become integral members of our parish community. ### Table manners

Someone once said we like our heroes dead more than alive. Cesar Chavez co-founded the United Farm Workers movement but found himself denounced as a communist and surveilled by the FBI during his lifetime. Only after death was his stature recognized, and he was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Encouraged by a priest who fueled him with Catholic social teaching, Chavez was also inspired by the nonviolent resistance of Gandhi. Along with lifelong co-worker Dolores Huerta, Chavez brought national attention to an abused yet fundamental part of our work force. Support farm workers' rights and remember at every table how your food got there.

### Seek what is hidden

Benedictine sister, best-selling author, and spiritual guide Macrina Wiederkehr was called a "master of everyday spirituality." She lived with the monastic community of St. Scholastica in Fort Smith, Arkansas and died on this day in 2020 at the age of 80. On this anniversary of her passing, let her words infuse your own everyday spirituality: "Holiness comes wrapped in the ordinary. There are burning bushes all around you. Every tree is full of angels. Hidden beauty is waiting in every crumb. . . . Real Presence is everywhere, and those with the hearts of children revel in it."

### Mark left his mark

Mark wasn't a direct disciple of Jesus but was quite active in the Early Church. He was closest to Peter, the latter returning to Mark's mother's house after escaping prison. According to Saint Jerome: "Mark, the disciple and interpreter of Peter, wrote a short gospel at the request of the brethren at Rome embodying what he had heard Peter tell. When Peter had heard this, he approved it and published it to the churches to be read by his authority." Mark's short, action-packed gospel highlights the immediacy of Jesus' actions; Mark also uses the word *euthéos*—Greek for "right away"—more than 40 times. How might the Spirit be tapping you to act with immediacy?

The Catholic Church teaches that the "Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life." As such, it is essential to feeding our spirit and showing us the way to holiness. The very act of listening to the Word, sharing our gifts, and breaking bread with others during Mass is a foretaste of God's reign, where all are welcome to the table. A U.S. Bishops-sponsored Eucharistic Revival is underway to encourage all to encounter Christ in the Eucharist

### The real deal

Today's gospel has a eucharistic theme, with talk of "living bread" and "flesh for the life of the world." One way the church emphasizes the Eucharist is its insistence on the Real Presence, that is, the core belief that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass truly are the Body and Blood of Christ. They are not just symbols but, as Saint John Damascene wrote, the "actual deified body of the Lord." If wrestling with that concept makes your head hurt, know that the church also acknowledges this is a "mystery"—something the mind cannot fully grasp. Leave it to the heart to understand.

### What's in your wallet?

Stored in coin wallets, pockets, purses, jewelry boxes, and glove compartments are many hundreds of little beads. Some are held together by string or wire, others fashioned into metal "decade" rings with laminated instructional cards. No matter what form they take, each reminds us of a special prayer of the Catholic Church, the Rosary. Saint Louis Grignion de Montfort, known for his love of the Rosary, always made sure to teach people to pray the Rosary in whatever method best helps them enter into the mysteries of the life of Christ.
