



SYNTHESIS OF THE SYNOD ON SYNODALITY The Roman Catholic Diocese of Metuchen, New Jersey, United States of America October 2021 - June 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

We recently completed the diocesan phase of the Synod on Synodality, which opened worldwide in October 2021. I am grateful for members of our diocesan Evangelization, Pastoral and Schools Offices for implementing a consultative process that offered a variety of ways for people from across the diocese to participate. By and large, participants testify to an experience through this process that brought joy and hope for renewal of the Church and of society.

By walking together and reflecting on our shared journey, our diocese has experienced a process that allowed for authentic listening to one another and to the Holy Spirit. This report is a synthesis of thousands of comments made at numerous listening sessions (both in-person and virtual), through online questionnaires and with one-on-one interviews. Pope Francis reminds us that the purpose of the Synod "is not to produce documents, but to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships awaken a new dawn of hope and learn from one another." Therefore, this report is not a strategic plan but a summary of recurring themes for us to reflect on and learn from as we continue our journey as a diocese. My sincere gratitude to all who participated in the synodal conversations.

This report, along with those from every Diocese, will be sent to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops for synthesis into one national report. In the coming year, the reports received from every region of the world will become a working document by the Vatican. With an eye on greater participation at the diocesan, national and global levels, a final working document will be presented and discussed at the General Assembly in Rome in October 2023.

Thank you for taking the time to read this report* and the thoughts of your fellow Catholics in the Diocese of Metuchen. Please consider how the Holy Spirit is calling you to use your gifts to participate in the mission of the Church. As we begin the work of discerning how to respond to joys and sorrows outlined in this report, let us pray in the words of the Adsumus (Prayer of the Synod): Holy Spirit, "teach us the way and how to pursue it."

Dizzy yet?

Do you ever feel like the world is spinning out of control? You're not alone: Pope Francis has called this effect of modern culture "rapidification." We're not unlike the tragic lamplighter in Catholic author Antoine de Saint-Exupéry's classic, *The Little Prince*. The lamplighter's planet is turning faster, but he still operates at the same mortal speed. He must now respond to 1,440 sunsets where there used to be just one. Now more than ever, we need to honor our Sabbaths and take our rest.

Alphonsus Liguori is the patron saint of many things, including the work of laypeople. Even though he was a founder of a religious order, the Redemptorists, he was, of course, first a layperson himself—and one with a successful career. A lawyer who didn't lose a case for eight years straight, he still found time in his busy schedule to visit the terminally ill, which is how he discovered his true vocation and became a priest and leading theologian. Liguori might be the first to advise: Take a break from work to give back to the community and you might get your big break in finding your mission.

Sor Isolina Ferré Aguayo, M.S.B.T., a Missionary Sister, died on this day in 2000 after a lifetime of service to the poor of her native Puerto Rico and New York. Known as the "Mother Teresa of Puerto Rico," Aguayo served people living on the margins and opened schools and resource centers throughout Puerto Rico and beyond. For her tireless work, she received 17 honorary degrees and more than 50 additional awards including the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1999, bestowed for "her passionate fight

against poverty, violence, and despair in Puerto Rico and Brooklyn, New York, where she worked to reconcile rival gangs in 1950-1960." In endowing the award, President Clinton said Sor Isolina taught people "to see the best in themselves and in their communities." May we all serve so well.

Persistence is a virtue

Sometimes a vocation comes packaged with obstacles. Perhaps it is God's way of testing our resolve. In any case, John Vianney, born in revolutionary France in 1786, modeled persistence in his determination to become a priest. His religious training was disrupted by the anticlerical reign of terror unleashed during the French Revolution. Priests in hiding who risked their lives to administer the sacraments became Vianney's heroes, and once the church was reestablished, Vianney entered seminary. Today we know him as the patron saint of parish priests. May his story inspire us to overcome obstacles that keep us from our God-given vocation, whatever that might be.

One of the most historic and significant churches is the Basilica of Mary Major in Rome. It was built out of deep love of Mary and her significance in salvation history. It holds many important relics, works of art, and the sacred experiences of pilgrims since the fifth century. What is a church that has been especially meaningful for you?

On August 6, 1945 at 8:15 in the morning, an atomic bomb exploded above Hiroshima, Japan, dropped from an American B-29 bomber. In an instant some 70,000 souls were incinerated by the 10,000-degree fireball generated in the blast. By the end of the year, injury and radiation doubled the total number of deaths. Seventy-five years later, Pope Francis declared the use of atomic weapons, even the mere possession of such devices, to be immoral. Reflect on the transfigured Christ who stands in solidarity with the suffering and dead of all crimes against humanity.




