This Moment in Prayer, Service and Community

Dear All: Christ's Peace!

SPECIAL SECTION: STAGE III OF OUR PAN- DEMIC EXPERIENCE: SEMI-FINAL MASS AD- JUSTMENTS & THANKING JESUS

All Masses – Today we enter the final week of our now-familiar, pandemic-Mass prayer practices. **Our four pandemic-Mass prayers will enter a new chapter on Independence Day, July 4.**

Our pre-Mass Jesus Prayer – The pandemic's earliest days, understandably, challenged our trust. Hence the pre-Mass Jesus prayer, "Lord Jesus Christ, Living Son of the Living God, help us to trust, more than ever, that You are loving us right now." Jesus answered that prayer in profound ways. Now, on advice of staff and many liturgical ministers, we will keep the pre-Mass Jesus prayer and change it according to the season. As of July 4, we will pray "Lord Jesus Christ, Living Son of the Living God, help us to know what You want, to want what You want, and to do what You want."

Pandemic Petitions – Throughout the pandemic, we have prayed for equipment, front-liners, backstory folks, everyone doing their bit, those in economic hardship, and everyone working for perfect peace. As of July 4, we will consolidate those prayers and pray extra for the people who live in places where the virus is particularly bad.

The Memorare – Since the pandemic's start, we have recruited Mary's extra help, especially by reciting the Memorare after the Prayers of the Faithful. Many of you have expressed gratitude for a Marion prayer during Mass. Again, on the advice of many, we will keep a Marion prayer, but change it according to the season. **Starting July 4, we will pray the Salve Regina:**

Salve Regina (Hail, Holy Queen)

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope.

To you do we cry, poor banished children of Eve.

June 27, 2021

*To you do we send up our sighs, mourning
and weeping in this valley of tears.*

*Turn, then, most gracious Advocate, your eyes
of mercy toward us,*

*and after this, our exile, show unto us the
blessed fruit of your womb, Jesus.*

O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Prayers after Mass – The earliest and scariest days of the shutdown prompted us to pray very sincerely for people on the front lines, people who had the virus, and people who died. After every daily Mass this week, we will pray for those who died from the virus. Next Friday, we will enter that list into our Book of Intentions for permanent remembrance. I am particularly grateful to everyone who let us know to pray for someone. These prayers, too, will be included in the single pandemic petition at every Mass.

8:00 am Sunday Mass – All continues to go well at the 8:00 Sunday Mass. We will keep this as an extra precautions Mass for the foreseeable future – every third pew (blue squares) and masks.

4:45 & 9:30 — Full steam ahead. We will keep the two center sections as “extra distance” for now. Thanks for cooperating with the ushers and making Communion flow smoothly.

11:30 – Starting July 4, everyone will turn into the first driveway and follow the signs. Mass helpers park in the first two rows. People with handicap stickers or the need to park close-in, go in the next few rows. Then comes general parking. People who want to stay in their cars will drive south, to the far end of the lot, make two rights, and head north to the reserved area. This will keep late arrivers from distracting us during Mass and, more importantly, keep cars away from kids and others sitting in the shady sections on the grass.

Gratitude to God – God rescued us from this plague. He gave humans the required brilliance and stamina to set us free from the pandemic’s wrathful hold. We are ready to move on when we have thanked God in three or four specific ways. What is on your list?

This Moment in Prayer

Adding More Liturgical Ministers – Our transition into Stage III allows us to include more liturgical ministers at every Mass. Thank heaven! The transition will occur gradually and steadily. The demand for lectors, servers, sacristans, Eucharistic Ministers, ushers, musicians, and singers is on the rise. Stay tuned.

Helpful Hand Posture – When receiving Communion, please extend your hands in “cup formation.”

Confirmations – We celebrated our last batch of the season’s Confirmation on Saturday morning. God bless our 80 confirmandi and their families and all who led them to the sacrament.

Confessions – Those who have tried Saturday morning, drive-up confession seem to be crazy about it. Especially now that Saturday morning confirmations are over, there are more slots. Let me know if you want to come for confession – or just for a 20-minute chat. This summer will also provide non-RSVP times.

This Moment in Service

The Bishop’s Annual Appeal – We have surpassed the 100% mark. Remember, from here on out, 50% percent comes back to the parish.

Summer Slowdown – As usual, this is a slightly slower time of year, but many long-term, low-burn ministries continue – and more will be rebooted late this summer. Enjoy your down time and may God bless whatever service work you are doing this summer.

Youth Group Summer Work Trips – Our High School trip leaves with 15 intrepid students on July 18 to North Haledon, NJ and will be providing service to the Paterson, NJ area. Our College trip will be leaving the following week to West Virginia and will volunteer with Grow Ohio Valley and the Appalachian Institute. Say your prayers for our students and for everyone we’ll support. If you’re interested in supporting the trip - or have a student who wants to attend (we have one spot open for each trip), please reach out to bobf@sjmillstone.com.

God is the champion of life

We're made for immortality. Christianity celebrates that death has no sting and life has no end. Our tenacious possession of the lives we're given is a sign of our refusal to accept death as the last word on the subject of our lives. We're impatient with limitations, reject gloom-and-doom projections, and insist on second opinions when the news is grim. We relentlessly cling to hope despite the odds of our predicament. God is on our side in this stubborn grip we have on life. God intends for death itself to pass away. Put your resources at the service of life.

TODAY'S READINGS: Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24; 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15; Mark 5:21-43 (98). *"God did not make death, nor does [God] rejoice in the destruction of the living."*

MEMORIAL OF IRENAEUS, BISHOP, MARTYR

We're part of the Lord's great chain of being

It's fun to consider "six degrees of separation"—the theory that everyone on Earth is connected to any other person by a chain of five acquaintances. Perhaps you even know how you are connected to someone famous. Imagine being only three degrees separated from Jesus! Saint Irenaeus is known for that claim. He studied under Polycarp, who had been a disciple of the apostle John. We may be countless more degrees removed than Irenaeus, but all Christians are part of the chain that goes back to our Lord because we're the beneficiaries of what's been passed down the links along the way—as well as being links ourselves to the future. Keep those connections strong.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 18:16-33; Matthew 8:18-22 (377). *"Teacher, I will follow you wherever you go."*

SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

Call me by my new name

Before Jesus, they were Simon and Saul; afterward, Peter and Paul. In the great biblical tradition, both experienced a name change to signify God's call to a new and greater destiny. They became the two pillars of the church. Jesus gave Peter the "keys" to unlock the "kingdom of God," on Earth as it is in heaven—the Kingdom Jesus preached about for three years. Paul received a "sword," the "sword of the Spirit" that's the word of God—which Paul used as he spread the gospel to new lands. Is there something new you can do for God today?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 12:1-11; 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18; Matthew 16:13-19 (591). *"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."*

Wednesday, Jun 30, 2021

You are part of God's agenda

Prayer has many forms and many expressions: It turns our hearts and minds to God with a desire to praise, to request, to give thanks, or to intercede on behalf of others. Prayer is conversation with God; sitting in silence with God; sharing with God every hope and fear we carry. But as Saint Thomas Aquinas reminds us, "We set forth our petitions before God, not in order to make known to Him our needs and desires, but rather so that we ourselves may

realize that in these things it is necessary to turn to God for help." Go ahead, place your concerns on God's desk. There's always space.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 21:5, 8-20a; Matthew 8:28-34 (379). *"When the poor one called out, the LORD heard."*

MEMORIAL OF JUNÍPERO SERRA, PRIEST, RELIGIOUS, MISSIONARY

Man on a mission

Today the church honors Saint Junípero Serra, the Spanish Franciscan missionary who tirelessly evangelized native peoples in California in the late 1700s, founding the first nine of 21 missions in the region. His sainthood is not without controversy since missionaries were enmeshed in the brutal Spanish conquest of the Americas, but Serra's record also shows he endured many hardships late in life for the sake of the gospel, genuinely loved the indigenous people, and defended their rights against the worst Spanish abuses. His memorial is a good time to learn about and pray for greater justice for Native Americans and all Indigenous Peoples.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 22:1b-19; Matthew 9:1-8 (380). *"He then said to the paralytic, 'Rise, pick up your stretcher, and go home.'"*

Friday, Jul 02, 2021

Pray for us sinners

Sometimes denial, shame, and fear keep us from recognizing the harmful effects of our sin. Pope Francis encourages us to give even our sin over to God. As he put it in a 2013 homily, "In my own life, I have so often seen God's merciful countenance, his patience; I have also seen so many people find the courage to enter the wounds of Jesus by saying to him: Lord, I am here, accept my poverty, hide my sin in your wounds, wash it away with your blood. And I have always seen that God did just this—he accepted them, consoled them, cleansed them, loved them." Draw close to Jesus and be comforted.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 23:1-4, 19; 24:1-8, 62-67; Matthew 9:9-13 (381). *"Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' I did not come to call the righteous but sinners."*

Saturday, Jul 03, 2021

FEAST OF THOMAS, APOSTLE

Let doubt deepen your faith

We have come to know today's saint as "Doubting Thomas," but in terms of his legacy, it was the missionary zeal that grew out of his doubt that endures. According to tradition, Thomas traveled far, reaching the Malabar Coast of southwest India, where he established a community still known today as "Saint Thomas Christians." A more diverse mix could not be found: the Nazranis, as they are called, are said to be "Indian in culture, Christian in faith, and Syrian in liturgy," with a dash of Jewish and Hindu influence for good measure. Your doubt can be the catalyst to a faith that endures and leaves a rich legacy. Ask God to help your unbelief!

TODAY'S READINGS: Ephesians 2:19-22; John 20:24-29 (593). *"You are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the holy ones."*
